







- >> Translation : Evil Eye Doll ; Usually made of Cement, wood or Terracotta
- >> A demon head from Hindu Mythology
- >> Used to keep away Evil gazes and bad thoughts
- >>Found outside most tamil households in TN
- >>Assosiated with the Folk Guardian Diety 'Ayyanar'

- >> Initialy thought it was an actual head of a creature later realized it was an inanimate sculpture
- >> Could be a warning to trespassers
- >> Could be local god
- >>Probably based on myth not real creatures.




- >>Uses steam to cook the puttu
- >> Water stored in the bottom part and heated from below
- >>The upper tubular container has a fine mesh which allows steam to escape upwards without the content flowing down
- >> Common in Keralite households

- >>Steam bases probably because of the holes on top.. could be a cooker
- >>probably used to make large quantities
- >>Could be a storage device too
- >>Used to store long items maybe




- >>Dindigul is the name of the a district in TamilNadu
- >>where these type of locks are manufactured
- >>Widely known for its safety, difficult to break
- >> Known to give a hard time for Thieves

- >>a more advanced form of security than other locks ive seen around
- >>looks pretty strong
- >> hard to break
- >>Experienced Locksmith work



- >>Also used in Winemaking as it requires long storage without air interferance
- >>Made of ceramic and sometimes clay
- >>There are stories about ghosts living in these.

- >>Seems airtight
- >>I wonder whats the reason behind only the top being colored
- >>Feels like there must be something delicious inside



- >> A wooden board usuall decorated and polished hung with decorative brass chains
- >> Sometimes paired with bells
- >>Usually found in rich households owned by land-
- lords and higher caste in the old times.


- >>Or for jst sitting maybe
- >>The decorative chains suggest higher class use >> Surprisingly entertaining to sit and move forth and back

>> Sometimes has pillows too



- >> Neem leaves are tied and hung outside homes in Tamilnadu
- >> Believed to fend off evil
- >>Has scientific significance too as neem leaves release maximum oxygen
- >> Has antibacterial properties and thus keeps the atmosphere clean wherever it is hung

- >> Leaves tied and hung out to dry them maybe
- >> Could be for Decorative purposes
- >>Possible Natural Air Purifier
- >>To Keep away insects maybe
- >> gravity Assisted growth technique ??




- Indian bobblehead or roly-poly toy

>> Made of Terracotta


>>These toys are traditionally handmade, finished with detailed, painted exteriors

- >> Replicates the beauty and movements of the artform beautifully




- >>Pulli Kolam is a style of rangoli commonly found in the south.
- >>You'll find ladies
- >>Kolam translates to "form" and "beauty" in Tamil and is revered as a symbol of auspiciousness and divinity.
- >> Each dot, line, curve, interlinking circle, triangle and square is said to represent the universe's energy and is backed by a heritage extending to over six centuries.

- >> Customised patterns in front of most homes
- >>maps or layouts???
- >>scientific illustrations??
- >> decorative patterns maybe
- >> Floor identification marks of homes maybe



- >>A curved knife with a sharp inner edge and wooden handles
- >> Used to Cut crops and clear weed plants
- >> Special curved shape to assist in harvesting crop bunches
- >>Represented as a Weapon used by Local Dieties worshipped by farmers
- >>An element in the widely used Communist Symbol depicting the workers

- >>Looks like a dangerous weapon
- >>Might be used for Beheading
- >>Multifunctional because of sharp inner edge and blunt outer edge
- >>Could be used as a carving blade
- >>A throwable boomerang weapon



- >>A terracotta pot used to cook and store food
- >>Meen Chatti translates to Fish Pot as it is widely used to make Fish Curry
- >> These pots are specially handmade and are seasoned and maintained for the cooking process
- >>Found in most keralite households
- >>Comically threatened to be broken on husband' Head by wives in kerala.

- >>Looks like a Container or utensil
- >>Materials looks like it with stands heat so probably used for cooking too
- >>Not very modern but still found in most Households
- >>Could Be used as a weapon if used correctly
